+ Elevate

Secure your important items, and move as many as possible to a higher place.

+ Unplug

Unplug all appliances and electronic devices from outlets and elevate them.

Create an Emergency Plan

Develop and practise a comprehensive emergency plan for your family, including evacuation routes, a communication strategy and designated meeting points.

YOURSELF FROM FLOODING.



FLOOD SAFETY TIPS DURING A FLOOD

- Stay informed: Tune into your local news for updates on flooding in progress.
- Consider evacuating to higher ground if you are in an area that is regularly subject to flooding.
- If you have time before you evacuate, turn off electricity breakers, water pumps and unplug appliances.

FLOOD SAFETY TIPS AFFER A FLOOD FLOOD

- Do not wade or play in remaining flood water as it may contain dangerous debris like broken glass or metal and sewage.
- + Thoroughly clean and disinfect everything that got wet by floodwaters.
- + Avoid drinking tap water until you know it is safe. If uncertain, boil or purify first.

WHETHER YOU ARE WALKING OR DRIVING STAY CLEAR OF FLOODWATERS



WET ROAD SAFETY TIPS

- Avoid driving through flood waters. Water, up to a car's hubcap is enough to move the car off the road.
- Roads and pavements can become slippery when wet, always proceed with caution.
- Reduce your speed when driving on wet roads to avoid potential accidents or loss of vehicle control.

WHETHER DRIVING OR WALKING, STAY CLEAR OF FLOODWATERS.



TURN AROUND DON'T DROWN!

- 6 INCHES Of FAST-MOVING WATER can knock adults off their feet and sweep them away.
- + 12 INCHES OF MOVING WATER can carry off a small car.
- + 18 TO 24 INCHES OF MOVING WATER can carry away larger vehicles including trucks, vans and SUVs.

TAKE PRECAUTIONS. STAY AWAY FROM FLOODWATERS, WHETHER DRIVING OR WALKING.
